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# Your experiences of safety in community-based mental health services.

## What is this study?

We are carrying out a study to find out more about the safety of mental healthcare delivered to adults in community settings.

## Who can take part?

**Service users** (past or present) and **carers/ family members** with experience of adult community-based mental health services, including:

- **Primary care** (e.g. treatment and monitoring of a mental health condition by a GP), and
- **Secondary care mental health services** (e.g. Crisis Resolution and Home Treatment Team, Community Mental Health Team).

Participants must be over 18 years old and able to understand English.


## What will the study involve?


Taking part in either a one-to-one interview or a group discussion about your views about safety in community-based mental health services, including suggestions for improving safety. Interviews and group discussions are likely to be conducted remotely, via a secure online platform (e.g. Microsoft Teams), and will last for up to one hour.
